Project Overview

Introduction to European Ecumenism is a training and community-building programme designed for young adults between 18-30 years of age participating in the 15th General Assembly of the Conference of European Churches. The event will bring together young adults who will take part in the Assembly as stewards, advisors and delegates.

The main objectives of the Youth Assembly are:

- to provide a general overview of the development of ecumenical relations in Europe, and practical information on the life and running of the General Assembly that will ensure efficient participation of young adults,
- to provide space and time for young adults to engage in the discourses of the General Assembly through introducing its goals and themes and providing possibilities for interaction in working sessions and social events,
- to enrich the discussions of the General Assembly with perspectives of different generations on relevant issues of the GA Agenda.

We plan to use the following methods for the programme, which intends to bring together young adults from a wide variety of Christian expressions from across Europe:

- o building trust and developing the sense of community by enhancing intercultural and ecumenical communication,
- o familiarizing participants with the history of ecumenism in Europe, opportunities and concerns,
- developing respect and appreciation for the diverse spiritualities and theological expressions in Europe,
- listening to and articulating fresh perspectives on witness, justice and hospitality in Europe today.
