## PLAYING GOD? – The science, theology, and societal issues on gene-editing

Gene-editing (in particular, germline editing) is one of the most important and controversial topics in modern bioethics. What are its implications for our understanding of what it means to be human? What effects might it have on society as well as on individuals and families? What limits ought to be set for scientific intervention in the process of human development?

At the conference we will hear from scientists who are at the leading edge of developing and potentially using new gene-editing techniques. They will be joined by theologians from Orthodox, Catholic, and Protestant approaches as we consider Christian responses to what has been described as the bioethical equivalent of splitting the atom. The theological views are followed up with contributions on the legal and societal issues.

By interacting directly with scientists we hope not only to gain an essential understanding of the techniques involved but also the motivation behind research and possible therapeutic applications.
